 - 3/6 Finance meeting with Jerry, Evan, and Vanessa rather than Evan/township purchasing the consumables and supplies to stock the makerspace, the library will purchase these items out of the library's Project of the Year account (not to exceed \$50,000); balance of the account will be given to the township to offset capital costs when spending is complete
 - Construction continues and is on schedule to be completed by March 31
