7. Bill No. 2020-09 - Ordinance Amendment - Chapter 27 (Zoning)

Accept public comment on an Ordinance Amendment to Chapter 27 (Zoning) to provide for an additional overlay district. The Missing Middle Housing (MMH) Overlay District would provide an additional mix of housing opportunities throughout the community.

(Following sworn testimony, it is the recommendation to continue the public hearing to the February 25, 2021 meeting)

Chairman Hadley opened the public hearing on the amending of Chapter 27 (zoning). Chairman Hadley stated the Board will not be acting on the Ordinance tonight because they have not received a recommendation from the Planning and Advisory Commission.

Kyle Beidler gave a presentation on the Missing Middle Housing (MMH) Overlay. Mr. Beidler stated the purpose of the overlay is to offer housing choices that are representative of muliple demographics.

Mr. Beidler explained Cranberry Township needs to be a community with a mix of land uses that maintains a diverse tax base and supports a high quality of life. To achieve this goal, the Township must accomplish land use policies that maintain a balanced tax base

and efficient use of remaining land resources.

Mr. Beidler stated the MMH would be an OPTIONAL overlay that could be applied to all Township parcels that are larger than twenty-five (25) acres. Currently there are approximately 27 parcels that meet this criteria. This is an option for land owners. It would require thirty (30) percent open green space, no multi-family apartments and no commerical uses. It would require a mix of housing similar to the homes found in Bellevue Park and Park Place.

Supervisor Skorupan stated this is only an option for developers.

Mr. Beidler confirmed it is only an option.

Chairman Hadley asked if the current zoning is residential.

Mr. Beidler replied most the parcels in question are zoned R1 and R2.

Chairman Hadley opened the floor for public testimony reminding all to confirm they had been sworn in and state their name and address for the record.

Blaine Wolf, 4235 Glen Eden Road, stated he represents the Graham Family. He stated the Graham Family supports the MMH.

John Kress, 101 Ridgemont Drive, expressed concerns in reference the MMH Overlay.

Chairman Hadley thanked Mr. Kress for his comments and advised residents to watch the Township website for information to address these concerns.

John Scarfutti, 103 Star View Lane, expressed concerns in reference to the MMH Overlay. Mr. Scarfutti spoke twice during the Public Hearing.

Robin Picker, 5758 Freshcorn Road, expressed concerns in reference to the MMH Overlay.

Chairman Hadley stated the issues will be addressed on the Township website or by contacting the Township offices.

Ryan Vandervort, 111 Overbrook Drive, expressed concerns in reference to the MMH Overlay.

Debra Cooper, 218 Jefferson Lane, expressed concerns in reference to the MMH Overlay.

Supervisor Mazzoni stated the Cranberry Comprehensive Plan was done with 80 plus citizens and is constantly updated.

Supervisor Skorupan stated there seems to be a misunderstanding, the Township is not a developer. Your fears are our fears. The Board will take them into account. Developers have rules and regulations they must follow. Your concerns are our concerns.

Supervisor Mazzoni stated our homes are valuable not just in dollars but in quality of life. The members of the Board are residents in this community. We want to see the best of this community for generations to come. Mr. Mazzoni asked residents to please connect with Township staff.

Supervisor Manipole stated the input from the community is valuable. We will address your concerns and questions as well as possible.

Dan Santoro circled back to the two individuals who had raised their hands to speak earlier this evening. The meeting organizer stated Mr. Shaner had raised his hand accidentally and Frank Campasino had signed off.

Chairman Hadley stated this public hearing is a time to state concerns. The Board does hear your concerns. We work together to have the best community possible.

Mr. Kluchurosky was excited to tell us the individual, employed last year by the Township, will be returning to the Waterpark for our next season.

Supervisor Manipole stated this type of cooperation is near and dear to his heart. He admires the drive to incorporate this into our environment.
