FACILITIES			
Municipal Building	Setup for Cranfest and elections. Staging the shredding file boxes in the PD for the annual records purge approved by the BOS. The HVAC unit in the antenna building the houses the water meter remote reading equipment along with the police radio repeaters has lost the compressor. The system is being replaced. Quotes have been emailed to all departments involved.		
Public Safety Training	Spurk HVAC was issued a PO to replace the condenser coil on the Mitsubishi heat pump for the training center.		
Highlands Clubhouse	A clean out was installed in the janitors closet at the clubhouse for quick access to the restroom sanitary sewer lines. Kennihan was brought in to jet the entire sanitary, lines from stacks to grinder tanks.		
Graham Park	Replaced a leaking trap primer in the ceiling of the pickle ball structure. There was no access to the device so a large steel access panel was cut into the ceiling for repair work.

Ambulance Bldg.	A-Air was brought in to provide the preventive maintenance service on the HVAC equipment. A data logger was set up to document the temperature and humidity of the building to help determine the cause of reported erratic temperature swings
Work Orders and Room Setup	Continuing to prioritize, complete and closeout work orders. BOS and PAC meeting are in person. Annual fire, sprinkler, and extinguisher testing has been completed for all facilities except Brush Creek.
Waterpark	Ceramic tile replacement is complete around the front edge of the zero depth. Tile was replaced to repair the cracked tile and eliminate or reduce the transition from tile to concrete to prevent tripping. Due to the condition of the sand play features the decision to remove them was made. Sand was dug out from around the supports and piping and wood was cut down to the base and filled with cement to eliminate any sharp edges. Walk in and ice machine were cleaned and started along with all other concession refrigeration equipment.
