# Call to Order

# 1. Pledge of Allegiance

Vice Chairman Hezlep called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers of the Cranberry Township Municipal Center, 2525 Rochester Road, Cranberry Township, PA, and led the salute to the flag.

# 2. Roll Call

When the meeting was called to order, the quorum consisted of Vice Chairman Hezlep, Supervisor Mazzoni, Supervisor Newpol, and Supervisor Skorupan. Supervisor Mazzoni participated virtually.

# 3. Oath of Office - Fire Police Officers

This evening, the Oath of Office for Fire Police Officers was administered to Brandon McKenzie, Kevin Williamson, and Jared Le Viere of the Cranberry Township Volunteer Fire Company.

Supervisor Hezlep welcomed the new Fire Police Officers and thanked them for their volunteer service. Supervisor Hezlep administered the Oath of Office to Brandon McKenzie, Kevin Williamson, and Jared Le Viere.

Chief Kevin Meyer presented each officer with a badge.

**5.** PR #PRD-23-1 - Cranberry Ridge PRD - Tentative PRD (TLD to open public hearing 4/7/23)

Accept public comment on a Tentative Planned Residential Development approval for a one phase, fourteen (14) building, three hundred eight (308) apartment unit Multiple Family Dwelling Planned Residential Development located along Coolsprings Drive on approximately 13.9 acres in the C-3 zoning district.

Prior to the start of the public hearing section of the meeting, stenographer, Jeanne Manko administered the Oath of Truth to those providing public testimony.

Ron Henshaw provided an overview of the Cranberry Ridge Tentative Planned Residential Development. Mr. Henshaw explained the plan is a division of Cranberry Springs and will consist of a fourteen (14) building multi-family dwelling plan. The plan will provide three hundred eight (308) apartments with surface parking.

Supervisor Newpol asked if the road and building will be constructed at the same time.

Ron Henshaw explained the road will be constructed first with a temporary turnaround for school buses. The Township has been working with Seneca Valley School District to address concerns with busing within the development.

Supervisor Skorupan inquired about the number of bedrooms in the apartments.

Mr. Henshaw said there will be one, two and three bedroom apartments available.
